a. Maintain professional standards of the medical resident physician, other members of the staff, patients and all individuals in the clinical setting.

b. Maintain self-awareness of own competence and seek assistance when clarification is needed.

Maintain self-awareness of own role and inform supervisor if this is a concern.

Inform patients and/or family members of their status as a medical student and the supervisor or physician under whom they are working.

Report supervisor or course director concerns about performance (standard or sub-standard).

Complete return evaluation in the time specified by the School of Medicine.

a. An student who is concerned with performance or behavior should address their concerns as soon as possible with the supervisor and/or course director.

An student who is dissatisfied with the outcome of such a report should report their concerns to the appropriate administrator with responsibility for clinical curricular activities on their home campus.

b. All reports will be held in strict confidence. However, if this information indicates a potential for student or patient safety, a comprehensive report should be completed, and other situations needing immediate contact with reporting individuals.

a. Office of Curriculum/Clinical Education Committee Review questionnaire data to identify ongoing concerns in clinical education and report on consistent problems and student reporting.

b. Variances from this policy must be approved by the Educational Policy Committee.
